

Lastacaft[®] (alcaftadine) – New over-the-counter approval

- On December 10, 2021, the FDA approved over-the-counter (OTC) use of Allergan's Lastacaft • (alcaftadine) 0.25% ophthalmic solution, to temporarily relieve itchy eyes due to pollen, ragweed, grass, animal hair and dander.
 - Previously, Lastacaft was available as prescription for the prevention of itching associated with allergic conjunctivitis.
- Patients should stop use of OTC Lastacaft if they experience eye pain, changes in vision, increased • redness of the eye, or itching that worsens or lasts for more than 72 hours.
- The recommended dosage regimen for Lastacaft in adults and children 2 years of age and older is 1 • drop in the affected eye(s) once daily.
- Allergan's launch plans for OTC Lastacaft are pending. Lastacaft will be available as a 0.25% • ophthalmic solution.



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
