

Vi-Jon – Expanded recall of magnesium citrate saline laxative oral solution

- On August 4, 2022, <u>Vi-Jon announced</u> a revision to the voluntary consumer-level recall of various brands of <u>Magnesium Citrate Saline Laxative</u> oral solution products to include product that was distributed in the United States, Canada and Panama. This recall includes all lots of cherry and grape flavors within expiry because they contain *Gluconacetobacter liquefaciens*.
- This is the third expansion to the recall that <u>Vi-Jon initially announced</u> on June 22, 2022. The first expansion was announced on <u>July 15, 2022</u> and the second expansion was announced on <u>July 25, 2022</u>.

- Magnesium citrate saline laxative is used for relief of occasional constipation.
- Immunocompromised patients, who consume this product, may be at increased risk for invasive infections caused by *Gluconacetobacter liquefaciens* that could lead to serious, life threatening adverse health consequences.
- To date, Vi-Jon, LLC is aware of three reports of an adverse reaction potentially related to this recall.
- Anyone with an existing inventory of the recalled product should stop use, distribution and quarantine the product immediately.
- Patients should contact their physician or health care provider if they have experienced any problems that may be related to taking or using recalled magnesium citrate saline laxative.
