

Reckitt – Recall of Enfamil ProSobee[®] Simply Plant-Based Infant Formula

- On February 20, 2023, Reckitt announced a consumer level recall of two batches of [ProSobee Simply Plant-Based Infant Formula](#) due to a possibility of cross-contamination with *Cronobacter sakazakii*.
- No other ProSobee Simply Plant-Based Infant Formula batches or other Reckitt products are impacted.
- ProSobee Simply Plant-Based Infant Formula was manufactured between August 2022 and September 2022. The products were distributed through retail stores nationwide in the U.S., Guam, and Puerto Rico. All product distributed went through extensive testing and tested negative for the bacteria.

- Per Rickett, *Cronobacter* bacteria can cause severe, life-threatening infections or meningitis. Symptoms of sepsis and meningitis may include poor feeding, irritability, temperature changes, jaundice, grunting breaths and abnormal movements. *Cronobacter* infection may also cause bowel damage and may spread through the blood to other parts of the body.
- To date, no illnesses or adverse events have been reported.
- Consumers who purchased ProSobee Simply Plant-Based Infant Formula should check the bottom of the can to identify whether the batch number is affected.
- Anyone with recalled product should dispose of the product or return to the place of purchase for a refund.
- Parents or caregivers who may have already fed their baby the affected formula should contact their physician or health care provider if they have experienced any problems that may be related to using the recalled product.
