

Lyrica® (pregabalin) – First-time generic

- On July 19, 2019, <u>Rising Pharmaceuticals launched</u> an <u>AB-rated</u> generic version of Pfizer's <u>Lyrica</u> (<u>pregabalin</u>) capsules.
 - In addition, <u>Alkem</u>, <u>Dr. Reddy's</u>, <u>Invagen</u>, <u>MSN Labs</u>, <u>Sciegen</u>, and <u>Teva</u> received FDA approval of AB-rated generic versions of Lyrica capsules on 7/19/2019. Launch plans for these generics are pending.
- Lyrica is indicated for:
 - Management of neuropathic pain associated with diabetic peripheral neuropathy
 - Management of postherpetic neuralgia
 - Adjunctive therapy for the treatment of partial-onset seizures in patients 1 month of age and older
 - Management of fibromyalgia
 - Management of neuropathic pain associated with spinal cord injury
- Pregabalin is also available as branded oral solution (Lyrica) and extended-release tablets (<u>Lyrica</u> CR).
 - The oral solution carries the same indications as Lyrica capsules.
 - Lyrica CR is indicated for the management of neuropathic pain associated with diabetic peripheral neuropathy and postherpetic neuralgia.
- According to IMS Health, Lyrica had U.S. sales of approximately \$5.5 billion for the 12 months ending March 2019.



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
