

Suboxone® (buprenorphine/naloxone) – First-time generic

- On February 20, 2019, <u>Alvogen</u> and <u>Dr. Reddy's launched</u> <u>AB-rated</u> generic versions of Indivior's <u>Suboxone (buprenorphine/naloxone)</u> sublingual film.
 - In addition, Sandoz launched Indivior's authorized generic version of Suboxone.
 - Mylan received FDA approval of an <u>AB-rated</u> generic version of Suboxone on June 14, 2018. Launch plans are pending.
- Suboxone is approved for treatment of opioid dependence.
 - Suboxone should be used as part of a complete treatment plan that includes counseling and psychosocial support.
- Buprenorphine/naloxone is also available generically as a <u>sublingual tablet</u>, a brand sublingual tablet (<u>Zubsolv</u>[®]) and a brand buccal film (<u>Bunavail</u>[®]) that all carry the same indication as Suboxone sublingual film.
