

Tykerb® (lapatinib) – First-time generic

- On September 30, 2020, <u>Lupin launched</u> an <u>AB-rated</u> generic version of Novartis' <u>Tykerb (lapatinib)</u> tablets.
- Tykerb is approved in combination with:
 - <u>Capecitabine</u> for the treatment of patients with advanced or metastatic breast cancer whose tumors overexpress human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 (HER2) and who have received prior therapy including an anthracycline, a taxane, and trastuzumab
 - <u>Letrozole</u> for the treatment of postmenopausal women with hormone receptor-positive metastatic breast cancer that overexpresses the HER2 receptor for whom hormonal therapy is indicated.
- Tykerb carries a boxed warning for hepatotoxicity.
- According to IQVIA, Tykerb had annual sales of approximately \$61 million as of June 2020.



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
