Kevzara [®] (sarilumab) Regeneron and Sanofi	New indication	Treatment of adult patients with polymyalgia rheumatica who have had an inadequate response to corticosteroids or who cannot tolerate corticosteroid taper
Livmarli® (maralixibat) Mirum	Expanded indication	Treatment of cholestatic pruritus in patients with Alagille syndrome 3 months of age and older
Tafinlar [®] (dabrafenib) plus Mekinist [®] (trametinib) Novartis	New indication, new formulation	Treatment of pediatric patients 1 year of age and older with low-grade glioma with a BRAF V600E mutation who require systemic therapy

Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, bivalent Pfizer/BioNTech	The FDA amended the emergency use authorization (EUA) of the Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, bivalent to provide for a single booster dose of the vaccine in children 6 months through 4 years of age at least 2 months after completion of primary vaccination with three doses of the monovalent (single strain) Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine.
Leqembi [™] (lecanemab-irmb) Eisai and Biogen	Eisai and Biogen announced that the FDA has accepted their supplemental Biologics License Application for Leqembi, requesting the conversion of the accelerated approval of Leqembi to a traditional (full) approval. The Leqembi application has been granted Priority Review, with a Prescription Drug User Fee Act action date of July 6, 2023.
Paxlovid [™] (nirmatrelvir/ritonavir) Pfizer	The FDA's Antimicrobial Drugs Advisory Committee recommended (16 yes and 1 no) that Paxlovid has a favorable benefit-risk assessment when used for the treatment of mild-to-moderate COVID-19 in adults who are at high risk for progression to severe COVID-19, including hospitalization or death.

Aprepitant Sandoz	125 mg capsules	Recall	Sandoz announced a consumer level recall of two lots of aprepitant capsules because the packaging is not child-resistant as required by the Poison Prevention Packaging Act, posing a risk of harm if children ingest the drugs. Aprepitant is indicated for the prevention of chemotherapy induced nausea and vomiting and for the prevention of postoperative nausea and vomiting.
Atovaquone Camber	750 mg/5 mL oral suspension	Recall	Camber announced a consumer-level recall of one lot of atovaquone oral suspension due to potential <i>Bacillus cereus</i> contamination in the product.

Brimonidine tartrate Apotex	0.15% ophthalmic solution	Recall	Apotex announced a consumer-level recall of six lots of brimonidine tartrate ophthalmic solution due to cracks that have developed in some of the units caps of bottles that may impact sterility and if so, the possibility of adverse events. Brimonidine ophthalmic solution indicated for the reduction of elevated intraocular pressure in patients with open-angle glaucoma or ocular hypertension.
Dabigatran Ascend	75 mg, 150 mg capsules	Recall	Ascend announced a consumer-level recall of dabigatran capsules due to the presence of a nitrosamine, N-nitroso-dabigatran, above the established FDA acceptable daily intake level. Dabigatran is used as an oral anticoagulant to lower the risk of stroke and blood clots.
Lidocaine/prilocaine Sandoz	2.5%/2.5% cream	Recall	Sandoz announced a consumer level recall of nine lots of lidocaine/prilocaine cream because the packaging is not child- resistant as required by the Poison Prevention Packaging Act, posing a risk of harm if children ingest the drugs or put the cream on their skin. Lidocaine and prilocaine cream is indicated as a topical anesthetic for use on normal intact skin for local analgesia and for use on genital mucous membranes for superficial minor surgery and as pretreatment for infiltration anesthesia.
Nurtec[®] ODT (rimegepant) Pfizer	75 mg orally disintegrating tablets	Recall	Pfizer announced a consumer-level recall of Nurtec ODT 75 mg orally disintegrating tablets sold in cartons containing one blister card of 8 tablets because the tablets are in a non-child resistant blister card.
